Looking Back: SPeD 2010

The much anticipated SPeD (Security Professional Education Development) Program was launched at last year’s DoD World Security Conference in Rosemont, Illinois. This new program provides security professionals with an accredited certification that is recognized and transferable throughout the DoD. Security practitioners were invigorated by this opportunity for professional development.

Following the August SPeD launch, DSS traveled to over 20 locations to administer the Security Fundamentals Professional Certification Beta Test. Bringing SPeD to the security community had positive results. Tom Wheeler, Chief of Information Security at Redstone Arsenal, commented, “After hearing about SPeD for the last few years, it was good to see movement and progression towards actual certification for our security professionals. After DSS came to visit Huntsville to administer the Beta Test, the community has a much greater sense of the significance of this program and how it will better professionalize and authenticate our security specialists.”

Outlook for 2011

Security professionals will have additional resources to assist them in obtaining a Security Fundamentals Professional Certification. DSS will be releasing the *Security Fundamentals Professional Certification Candidate Handbook* and a diagnostic test in the future. Locations and schedules for SPeD briefings and testing will also be released in the next weeks.

Security Asset Protection Professional Certification beta testing will launch at the DoD Security Conference this summer.

SPeD Beta Test Turnout Exceeds Expectations

The results are in! Nine hundred and twenty-seven security practitioners took the Security Fundamentals Professional Certification Beta Test. This far exceeded the Department's goal of testing 500 candidates. Defense Security Service proctors traveled to test sites across the U.S. to test DoD candidates.

DSS appreciates the support provided by test centers throughout the U.S. who participated in beta testing. The contributions of the test centers were critical to DoD reaching its goal.

Security professionals were excited to be involved with beta testing. According to Michael Scott, Chief of Information Security at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, "The response to the test and the certification concept from the community has been phenomenal. Most are stating that the program is long overdue. I've taken the first test myself, and as a manager of security professionals, it clearly outlines DoD expectations for security professionals."

During the next weeks, DSS will use results from the beta tests to develop the final test and determine the passing score. Beta candidates will receive their results in February from their Component Program Office.

Launching the Security Fundamentals Professional Certification

Now that the Beta phase of the Security Fundamental Professional Certification has ended, DSS is preparing to launch the production version of the program. Be sure to ask your Component Point of Contact (POC) for more information about test dates.

On the Horizon...

Scheduling a SPeD Certification Assessment

Before beginning the process, notify your supervisor of your plans to schedule a SPeD Certification Assessment.

Step One: Component must identify you as an applicant or you may volunteer based on your Component's SPeD Candidate policy.

Step Two: Create or update your ENROL account to be added to the SPeD Certification Audience.

Step Three: Contact your Component SPeD Program Management Office to schedule your test date and time.

Step Four: Register for the Certification Assessment via SPeDCert.Registration@DSS.MIL with your confirmed scheduled test site location, date and time.
